

Extract adapted from the judgment of Lord Denning in *Bratty v AG for Northern Ireland* [1963] AC 386 HL



So, below are a couple of quotes from the source, and some tasks related to them, so that you can <u>build on</u> the information and start adding your own understanding.

1. "When dealing with a murder case the Crown must prove (a) death as a result of a voluntary act of the accused and (b) malice of the accused." (lines 1-2)



2. "No act should be punishable if it is done involuntarily" (line 4)

3. "A spasm, a reflex action or convulsion; or an act done by a person who is not conscious of what he is doing."

Look at the following scenarios and decide whether they could plead automatism on the basis of Denning's guidance.

Scenario	Automatism?	Reason
James hits Sam in the head. Sam suffers a brain		
bleed, blacks out and attacks James.		
Stan sneezes a lot, and stabs Louise with the		
knife in his hand.		
Pedro is focused on texting his mum, and		
crashes his car, hurting Leon.		
Sophie has a brain tumour and blacks out. She		
steals next door's cat.		
Jules takes his mum's valium to calm down. He		
goes mental and burns the house down.
